International sting arrests 24 over India-based organised crime

An international operation against Indian organized crime groups has led to 24 arrests, US officials said Tuesday, including in connection with the assassination in Canada of a prominent Sikh figure.

The sting involved law enforcement officials operating in the United States, Canada and Europe, who had together been probing crime syndicates that engage in racketeering, targeted killings, shootings, extortion and drug trafficking.

Dozens of people have been charged, including two who US officials say ran their global criminal syndicates while in prison in India. All but 10 of them are now in custody.

"Transnational criminal gangs who spread fear, drugs, and violence will face the full force of justice and the weight of the federal government," said First Assistant United States Attorney Bill Essayli.

Among the crimes alleged in indictments unveiled Tuesday is the 2023 killing of Canadian citizen Hardeep Singh Nijjar, a prominent Punjabi-born campaigner for "Khalistan" -- a separatist movement that seeks an independent homeland for Sikhs.

Lawrence Bishnoi, 33, of Punjab -- whose organization is designated as a terrorist enterprise in Canada -- is charged with ordering the killing from his Indian prison cell.

Officials say that in public Bishnoi billed himself as a deeply religious "patriot," but used this image to recruit members and associates to his crime syndicate in India, the United States, and elsewhere.

In private, they say, he presided over a sweeping criminal enterprise that spanned multiple continents, personally directing political assassinations, murders, shootings, extortion, kidnappings, drug trafficking, human smuggling, and other crimes.

Also charged is Jaggu Bhagwanpuria, 38, of Punjab, India, a gangster imprisoned in India who is an associate-turned-rival of Bishnoi. Bhagwanpuria founded his own crime gang that now has over 1,000 members across the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, Europe, Australia, and New Zealand.

Bhagwanpuria is charged alongside 16 other defendants with operating a criminal enterprise that engaged in murder-for-hire, drug trafficking, kidnappings, extortion, weapons trafficking, and other crimes around the world, including in the United States and Canada.

Drug mules flooding region face tougher penalties

British "mules" caught smuggling cannabis from Thailand face jail and a charge for every kilo they are carrying under new tough measures to combat a drug trafficking "explosion".

The National Crime Agency (NCA) warning came after [a BBC North West investigation](#) heard how gangs were making huge profits sending couriers from Bangkok to the UK with loads in suitcases destined for the streets of the cities and towns of the north of England.

The agency is joining Thai Authorities and the Home Office to combat the surge.

Anyone caught trying to fly the drug out of Thailand will have to pay Thai Customs 30,000 Baht – the equivalent to around £68 per kilogram of cannabis – to leave the country.

The number of smuggling attempts from Thailand has continued to rise sharply – despite efforts to tighten relaxed laws there around cultivation – as dealers attempt to cash in on huge demand for super-strength weed.

Last year, 976 air passengers were caught arriving in the UK with cannabis, a massive increase from the 142 arrested in 2023.

And 2026 has seen 600 couriers arrested at UK airports in the first six months, according to the NCA.

The agency said the "average" smuggler is caught in Thailand with 26 kg (57lb) – which would result in a fine of £17,680 under the new rules brought in on 17 June.

Failure to pay, it said, would lead to a criminal prosecution with up to two years in jail.

Beki Wright, head of the NCA's borders threat team, warned would-be couriers that "the crime group that paid you to smuggle it will leave you high and dry".

She added: "If convicted, you face potentially life-changing jail sentences both in the UK and especially abroad. You'll also have a criminal record, which could wreck future job prospects and your ability to travel abroad.

"It just isn't worth the risk."

Since the measures were brought in, 55 smugglers have been caught - 21 of them British nationals. Mules from other countries are also subject to the new measures.

Phanthong Loykulnanta, director general of Thai customs, said: "The illegal export of cannabis is one of the criminal activities carried out by transnational organised crime networks, making our continued cooperation more important than ever.

"We believe that our new enforcement measure marks an important milestone in strengthening Thailand's efforts to combat the illegal export of cannabis.

"We are confident that these measures will make cannabis smuggling increasingly difficult and contribute to a significant reduction in the number of offenders."

The BBC's investigation found drugs gangs were flooding the north of England with cheap cannabis grown overseas and sold to mimic slickly marketed, legal marijuana from the United States.

A thriving black market for "Cali weed" - high-potency strains originally cultivated in licensed dispensaries in California - has prompted an unprecedented wave of smuggling from dealers growing it in countries including Thailand.

One dealer boasted he made massive profits importing cannabis and described how he sent drug couriers from Thailand to the UK, even though he knew "most will get caught".

According to Home Office figures, Border Force officials last year seized more than 167,000kg (368,18lb) of herbal cannabis with an estimated street value of more than £2bn - the highest amount ever recorded and up 52% from 2024.

The UK Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office has updated its Travel Advice for Thailand to reflect the new penalties and remind travellers of the serious consequences of attempting to smuggle cannabis.

54 guns, large amount of drugs seized after arrest of Salem man

A 47-year-old Salem man was arrested in connection to a domestic stalking incident in which Salem Police and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives seized a large number of firearms and hundreds of grams and vials of illegal drugs.

The man was arrested July 6 on charges including felony stalking, burglary and unlawful use of a GPS device, police said. He was also in violation of a no-contact order.

Police on July 7 seized 54 firearms, eight homemade suppressors, firearm parts and thousands of rounds of ammunition. They also seized evidence relating to the creation of undetectable firearms, including 3D printers and firearm build kits.

Police also found 129 grams of psilocybin mushrooms, 88.7 grams of fentanyl, 20.1 grams of cocaine and over 150 vials of anabolic steroids. Evidence of the creation of anabolic steroids was also located and seized.

The search and seizures were conducted at multiple locations connected to the man, police said. Charges related to the firearms are pending.

The man is also facing charges related to assault and strangulation, court records show. In that case he was granted bail on the condition he does not possess firearms.

The man is being held at the Marion County Jail without bail, court records show. His next court date is at 9:30 a.m. July 15.

Ravinder Singh Dhanda, 57, of Vancouver, Canada, is one of 11 people charged with a massive drug smuggling operation that authorities say saw them import hundreds of kilograms of cocaine and methamphetamine each week from the US into Canada.

"Today's coordinated operation strikes at the heart of three brutal transnational organizations that have terrorized families, exploited communities, and stolen lives through ruthless acts of violence in the US and abroad," said Patrick Grandy, Assistant Director in Charge of the FBI's Los Angeles Field Office.

5 held with drugs in Assam's Barpeta

Barpeta, Jul 8 (PTI) Five suspected drug peddlers were arrested with heroin, Yaba tablets and banned cough syrup in a series of anti-narcotics operations across Assam's Barpeta district, police said on Wednesday.

The raids were conducted in Barpeta town, Barpeta Road, Howly and Sarthebari, they said.

At Barpeta Road, police seized 0.76 grams of heroin packed in eight vials, 240 Yaba tablets, Rs 42,940 in cash and two mobile phones.

In Barpeta town, officials recovered 0.52 grams of heroin, five Yaba tablets, 63 empty containers and two syringes.

The operation at Howly led to the seizure of 11.84 gram of heroin concealed in a soap box, 0.01 grams of heroin kept in a plastic vial and a mobile phone.

In Sarthebari, police recovered 172 bottles of banned cough syrup suspected to be meant for illegal distribution.

Five persons were arrested in connection with the seizures, and further investigation is underway, police said. PTI SSG SSG SOM

Rs 1 Crore Suspected Drug Haul: Sribhumi Police Arrest Two in Night Raid

Sribhumi Police seized around 500 grams of suspected heroin and arrested two alleged drug traffickers, including a local Asom Gana Parishad (AGP) leader, during a joint operation carried out by Badarpur and Kaliganj police stations on Tuesday night (July 7).

The arrested persons have been identified as Anwar Hussain, a local AGP leader, and Shakil Uddin. Both are residents of Kankalesh village in Sribhumi district. Police also seized a motorcycle bearing registration number AS10 8883, which was allegedly used to transport the suspected narcotics.

According to Sribhumi Police, the operation was launched after Senior Superintendent of Police Lina Doley received specific intelligence about the movement of a drug consignment. Acting on the information, officers from Kaliganj Watch Post and the Maluwa Police Investigation Centre conducted a joint raid at Bhanga Station Road under Badarpur Police Station.

During the operation, the police recovered around 500 grams of suspected heroin packed inside 30 soap boxes. According to the police, the seized contraband has an estimated international market value of around Rs 1 crore.

Addressing the media, Additional Superintendent of Police Trinayan Bhuyan said Sribhumi Police regularly conducts operations against drug trafficking and will continue such drives in the future. Referring to the latest operation, he described it as successful and confirmed the seizure of around half a kilogram of suspected heroin along with the arrest of Shakil Uddin and Anwar Hussain.

Bhuyan said the investigation is continuing to establish both the backward and forward links of the drug network. Police are examining where the suspected heroin was sourced from and where it was meant to be delivered. He added that investigators are looking into all possible angles of the case. Further investigation is underway.

Police Seize Over 47kg of Marijuana and detains Three peddlers in Hatigaon

Guwahati: The Guwahati Police seized more than 47 kilograms of **ganja** in two coordinated operations in the area of Hatigaon and Beharbari on Wednesday, detaining three alleged drug peddlers.

The operation, carried out by the [Hatigaon Police](#), led to the recovery of 45.8 kg of ganja from a rented house on Arunoday Path in Hatigaon. Two people, identified as Asminur Mia of Barpeta and Rustam Ali of Sipajhar, were taken into custody in connection with the seizure.

Police said the raid was part of an ongoing drive to crack down on the illegal narcotics trade in the city.

Moreover, during interrogation, the two accused allegedly revealed the involvement of another associate, identified as Akhtar Ali, who was reportedly operating from beneath the Beharbari flyover.

Acting on the information, the police launched a second operation at the location and recovered an additional 1.58 kg of ganja from Akhtar Ali's possession. He was subsequently detained, taking the total number of arrests in the case to three.

Police said further investigations are underway to ascertain the wider network involved in the illegal drug trade. Police added that the accused are being interrogated to identify other people linked to the racket and to dismantle the supply chain operating in the region.

इम्फाल। मणिपुर पुलिस और सुरक्षा बलों ने उग्रवाद तथा मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी के खिलाफ चलाए जा रहे अभियान के तहत बीते 24 घंटे में प्रतिबंधित संगठनों के दो सक्रिय उग्रवादियों को गिरफ्तार किया है। साथ ही संयुक्त अभियान में लगभग 22 किलोग्राम मेथामफेटामाइन (वाईवाई टैबलेट) भी बरामद की गई है।

आज दी गई आधिकारिक जानकारी के अनुसार, मणिपुर पुलिस ने बुधवार को प्रतिबंधित संगठन केवाईकेएल के सक्रिय उग्रवादी ताखेल्लाम्बम ग्रेमीचंद उर्फ इनाओचा सिंह (52) को इम्फाल पूर्व जिले के इरिलबुंग थाना क्षेत्र के कालिका बामोन काम्पू इलाके से गिरफ्तार किया। उसके कब्जे से एक 9 एमएम पिस्तौल, दो मैगजीन और 70 जिंदा कारतूस बरामद किए गए।

इससे पहले सुरक्षा बलों ने प्रतिबंधित संगठन केसीपी (पीडब्ल्यूजी) के सक्रिय उग्रवादी अंगोम चिंगखेंगनबा मैतेई (27) को काकचिंग जिले के वैखोंग थाना क्षेत्र के आइहांग विलेज गेट से गिरफ्तार किया। वह कथित रूप से उगाही की गतिविधियों में शामिल था।

इसी दिन मणिपुर पुलिस और नारकोटिक्स कंट्रोल ब्यूरो (एनसीबी) की संयुक्त टीम ने चुराचांदपुर स्थित पाओमिनलिन मुनलो के घर पर छापेमारी कर 19 पैकेटों में रखी लगभग 22 किलोग्राम वाईवाई टैबलेट (मेथामफेटामाइन) बरामद की। मौके से एक महिंद्रा बोलेरो वाहन भी जब्त किया गया।

इस बीच, सुरक्षा बलों ने राज्य के संवेदनशील और सीमावर्ती क्षेत्रों में तलाशी अभियान तथा क्षेत्र प्रभुत्व अभियान जारी रखा। राष्ट्रीय राजमार्ग-37 पर आवश्यक वस्तुओं से लदे 151 वाहनों की सुरक्षित आवाजाही सुनिश्चित की गई। वहीं, पहाड़ी और घाटी क्षेत्रों के विभिन्न जिलों में कुल 114 नाका एवं चेक पोस्ट स्थापित कर सुरक्षा व्यवस्था और कड़ी कर दी गई।

Joseph Vanlalhruaia's journey from battling drug addiction to becoming a world champion in combat sports is one of resilience, redemption and determination.



Joseph Vanlalhruaia's journey from battling drug addiction to becoming a world champion in combat sports is one of resilience, redemption and determination.

Once trapped in substance abuse, the Mizoram native has transformed his life to become India's first-ever World Muaythai Organization (WMO) World Champion, inspiring thousands of young people across the state and beyond.

Joseph scripted history in March 2024 by becoming the first Indian to win the prestigious WMO World Title Belt. Competing in the 51 kg category at the 6th International Thai Martial Arts Games in Pattaya, Thailand, he defeated Taiwan's Yeh Lichih via a decisive stoppage to claim the world title. His achievement earned widespread recognition from sporting bodies as well as Mizoram Chief Minister Lalduhoma.

Based in Kochi, Kerala, Joseph trains and competes under Spartans Martial Arts and Fitness. He is also the co-founder of Thai Machines Xtreme Gym and is associated with the Team Joseph Movement in Mizoram.

However, his path to international glory was anything but easy.

Growing up in an environment where drug abuse was widespread, Joseph succumbed to peer pressure and addiction at a young age. As substance abuse took over his life, he struggled to survive, working as a daily-wage labourer while facing social stigma and an uncertain future.

Determined to change his life, Joseph decided to fight his addiction with the same discipline and resilience that would later define his sporting career. Through perseverance and unwavering commitment, he overcame substance abuse and dedicated himself to martial arts.

His remarkable turnaround eventually led him to the pinnacle of the sport. Following his WMO world title triumph, Joseph further strengthened his credentials by defeating a ONE Championship fighter from Vietnam in Thailand, cementing his reputation on the international stage.

Today, Joseph's story has become a symbol of hope for countless young people battling addiction. Widely regarded as Mizoram's "Cinderella Man", he continues to inspire the youth to believe that no setback is insurmountable.

His message to the younger generation is simple but powerful:

"Life is hard—but you gotta fight through it."

Joseph Vanlalhraia's journey stands as a testament to the power of perseverance, proving that with determination and courage, it is possible to overcome even the darkest chapters of life and emerge stronger.

Keralam to hold meeting with southern states CMs to strengthen anti-drug drive: Home Minister Ramesh Chennithala

Thiruvananthapuram (Keralam) [India], July 8 (ANI): Keralam Home Minister Ramesh Chennithala on Wednesday said the state government will convene a meeting with the Chief Ministers of southern states to strengthen coordination under its anti-drug campaign, 'Operation Toofan', as part of efforts to curb the growing menace of narcotics.

Speaking to reporters, Chennithala said he would begin consultations with neighbouring states by meeting the Karnataka Chief Minister before reaching out to other southern state leaders.

'We will hold a meeting with the CMs of all the southern states regarding 'Operation Toofan'. Today, I will meet the CM of Karnataka, and later I will meet the other CMs. The menace of drugs has to stop, which is why we are taking action,' Chennithala said.

The proposed meeting comes as Kerala intensifies its anti-drug enforcement through Operation Toofan, a statewide campaign targeting drug trafficking and the illegal possession of narcotic and psychotropic substances.

The campaign has resulted in thousands of arrests and multiple cases registered under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, according to state authorities.

Earlier on July 3, four persons, including an Army personnel, were arrested for allegedly assaulting police officers during a vehicle inspection conducted as part of Operation Toofan at Payattamkunnu in Palakkad district.

According to police, a team led by Hemambika Nagar Sub-Inspector S Sudarshana had signalled a car approaching from the Malampuzha side to stop for a routine inspection. During the search, officers allegedly recovered a bottle of liquor from inside the vehicle.

Police said that when the occupants were asked to step out of the vehicle for further verification, they allegedly attacked the police team.

Sub-Inspector Sudarshana sustained injuries during the altercation, while Grade Sub-Inspector John Xavier and Senior Civil Police Officer Rajeeesh were also injured when they intervened.

Following a prolonged struggle, police overpowered the four occupants and took them into custody.

According to the police, the assault was allegedly led by Jijeesh, an Army personnel from Kanjirappuzha in Mannarkkad, who had recently returned home on leave from Ranchi.

A case has been registered against all four accused for allegedly obstructing public servants from discharging their official duties. Further investigation is underway.

In another action under Operation Toofan, a tattoo artist from Sikkim was arrested at Palakkad Junction Railway Station after Excise officials, during a joint inspection with the Railway Protection Force (RPF), allegedly recovered prescription Tramadol tablets from his possession without valid authorisation.

The Kerala government has maintained that Operation Toofan will continue with intensified enforcement and inter-state coordination to tackle drug trafficking networks operating across southern India. (ANI)

Together we fight: Narcotics Anonymous.

When Basheer boarded a train to Mumbai in 2003, he was not chasing a job or a new beginning. He was fleeing a life consumed by drugs.

Before leaving, he stole the gold chain of his 40-day-old baby sister to fund the journey. By then, addiction had taken him from smoking cannabis to injecting brown sugar. To sustain his dependence, he had become a drug peddler himself. "I was going crazy. I knew it," he smiles.

He could no longer remain in his hometown in Malappuram. Mumbai offered no escape either. His addiction worsened and he ended up begging on the streets.

"I had reached a point where there was nothing left," Basheer recalls. "It was then that I first heard about Narcotics Anonymous."

More than two decades later, Basheer is among a growing number of recovering addicts in Kerala who credit the fellowship with helping them stay drug-free. Not through medicine or counselling alone, but through shared experiences, mutual support and hope.

Their stories have gained renewed relevance after a recent discussion in the Kerala assembly on strengthening rehabilitation alongside the government's anti-drug campaign, Operation Toofan.

Thodupuzha MLA Apu John Joseph said in the house that while the state had intensified action against drug peddlers and users, recovery must become an equally important part of the fight against narcotics.

Pointing out that many users eventually become part of the distribution network, he urged the government to help establish Narcotics Anonymous (NA) groups in every district. Home Minister Ramesh Chennithala responded that the proposal was "a very valid suggestion" and assured the house it would be considered.

"When I spoke to people who had reclaimed their lives through NA in other states, I realised Kerala is one of the few places where the fellowship has not received the attention it deserves," Apu tells TNIE.

"That is what prompted me to raise the issue in the assembly. Alongside de-addiction treatment, there should also be a structured community support system like NA. Strengthening community-based recovery programmes is an important part of addressing the drug menace."

For recovering addicts, the proposal acknowledges something they have known for years: arresting users alone rarely breaks the cycle of addiction.

Tushar (name changed), a software engineer who has been “clean” for five years, says society is yet to understand that addiction is akin to a mental health condition.

“NA is not a treatment programme. It is a worldwide fellowship of recovering addicts who meet regularly to help one another remain drug-free,” he explains.

“The meetings are free, voluntary and anonymous. There are no doctors, fees, counsellors or paid facilitators. People can be a part of it for years without spending a single rupee. Members simply share their personal experiences, support newcomers and encourage one another through recovery.”

Tushar adds there are many misconceptions about NA. “It is not an NGO or a religious platform. There is only one requirement for membership — the desire to stop using drugs,” he says.

“Anyone may join us regardless of age, race, sexual identity, creed or religion. Even atheists can join. The ‘God’ referred to in NA is often described as ‘God of your understanding’. Some people interpret it as nature, group energy or even ‘Good Orderly Direction’.”

Politics, he stresses, is also a strict no-no. “Even now, we don’t expect government funding or involvement. The only thing the government can do is to provide a space for meetings and help spread awareness,” he says.

Tushar highlights that people from all walks of life attend meetings together. “Businessmen, doctors, lawyers, auto-rickshaw drivers and college students — there is no class barrier here,” he says.

For Abin (name changed), a longtime NA member, that sense of community arrived much later than he wished.

“When I underwent treatment in 2004, there wasn’t even an official NA group in Kerala,” he says. “Instead, I attended Alcoholics Anonymous meetings because that was the only support system available.”

Many of those who sat beside him in those early meetings are no longer alive. “Several died after relapsing into prolonged drug use. Only one or two of them are still alive,” he says.

Today, Abin has remained drug-free for over 17 years. He remembers travelling to Tamil Nadu, Mysuru and Goa to attend NA conventions because there was no organised network in Kerala. It was only in 2011 that a dedicated NA group was started in Kozhikode. Meetings, which shifted online during the pandemic, are now held in person every Sunday.

“I thought I could never stop using drugs,” he says. “My life had collapsed mentally, physically and financially. But when I met others who had gone through the same struggles and recovered, I realised I wasn’t alone.”

Looking back, Abin says his addiction did not begin with hard drugs. “I started smoking in Class 7. Friends cheered and I felt accepted. Later, drugs became an escape from questions about life that I didn’t know how to answer. Drugs became my crutches. I struggled to walk once I quit it. That’s where the NA fellowship helped — to stand back on my feet again.”

He now notices striking similarities in the stories of newcomers attending NA meetings. “Many of us grew up with feelings of rejection, low self-esteem or emotional pain. The backgrounds may differ, but the experiences are often the same,” he says.

For Nithin (name changed), recovery remains a daily process rather than a destination. He says trauma, untreated mental health issues and attention deficit hyperactivity disorder shaped his struggle with substance abuse from the age of 16. What began with cigarettes progressed to cannabis and eventually synthetic drugs.

“I always thought rehabilitation would solve everything,” he says. “But even after rehab, the cravings didn’t disappear.” The easy availability of drugs often led him to replace one substance with another.

“When I tried to stop one drug, another would come into my life. That’s when I understood recovery needs continuous support.”

He found that support in NA. “The biggest strength of NA is listening to other people’s stories. When someone describes emotions you’ve lived through yourself, you begin to believe recovery is possible,” he says.

“Only another addict truly understands what another addict is going through. Families may love and support us, but they cannot fully grasp how excruciating withdrawal symptoms can be or how addiction tricks the mind into remembering only the high while erasing the pain it caused.

When someone in recovery speaks about those same thoughts, you realise you are not alone.” He says the fellowship has also helped reduce his dependence on mobile phones and distance himself from friends who continued using drugs.

“Society still sees me as a drug addict. But in NA, people don’t judge me. They call, check on me and genuinely care whether I remain clean,” he smiles.

Welcoming the discussion on NA in the assembly, psychiatrist Dr Arun B Nair says people recovering from addiction often face peer pressure or emotional distress, both of which can trigger relapse.

“NA can play an important role in rehabilitation. It brings together people who have gone through similar struggles with addiction,” he says.

“Through their meetings, they learn practical ways to cope with peer pressure and emotional distress, and develop healthier responses to challenges.”

Dr Arun adds that when a person who has overcome addiction helps another individual recover, it gives their life a renewed sense of purpose and fulfilment. “Someone once seen as a burden by their family and society becomes a person helping others.

That transformation restores dignity, earns respect within the family and community, and significantly improves self-esteem,” he notes.

“In that sense, the process benefits both the individual receiving support and the one offering it.” Basheer echoes the same belief. “NA doesn’t preach or lecture anyone,” he says.

“People simply share what addiction did to their lives and how they recovered. Newcomers are treated as the most important person in the room. Thereon, recovery becomes a lifelong commitment.”

For Basheer, that journey began not in a courtroom or a rehabilitation centre, but in a small gathering of strangers who introduced themselves with the same words: “I am a recovering addict.”

Anti-drug drive: Northern Range police seize narcotics worth Rs 12.3L

Belagavi: A special week-long anti-drug drive by Northern Range police has led to the registration of 16 cases and the seizure of nearly 27 kg of narcotic substances worth over Rs 12.3 lakh. The drive was conducted between June 21 and 28, as part of Drug Awareness Week and coincided with activities marking the International Day Against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking. Coordinated operations were carried out across Belagavi, Vijayapura, Bagalkot, Dharwad and Gadag districts. Police raided suspicious locations, monitored the activities of suspected peddlers, reviewed the records of habitual offenders, and conducted awareness programmes.

The crackdown comes after senior IPS officer Sandeep Patil assumed charge as the IGP, Northern Range. Several preventive measures have since been initiated to curb the storage, transportation, sale, and consumption of narcotic substances.

According to police, 427 kg and 29 grams of narcotic substances have been seized under the NDPS Act across North Range so far in 2026. The estimated value of the seized contraband is Rs 1,12,49,510. During the special operation from June 21 to 28, police seized 26 kg and 987 grams of narcotic substances valued at approximately

Rs 12,38,788. Officials said the figures point to the need for sustained enforcement and surveillance, as the drug trade could be spreading into smaller towns and rural pockets.

Police have initiated stringent action against four individuals--Nagaraj Doddappa Mutaraj of Gadag, Deepak Ravasaheb Naik of Hukkeri, and Baburao Lavate and Yallappa Chavan of Vijayapura district, for allegedly being involved in repeated storage, sale and transportation of narcotics.

Police conducted a total of 1,106 awareness programmes in schools and colleges, across the five districts.

3 youths assaulted, heads shaved by mob over Ganja allegation in Kerala

Perumbavoor, Kerala: Three youths were allegedly assaulted, publicly humiliated and forcibly had their heads shaved by a mob after being accused of selling ganja in Perumbavoor on Wednesday, police said after the victims lodged a complaint.

The incident occurred around 4 pm in Kandanthara, Perumbavoor. The complainants have been identified as Gokul (18) of Manjappetty, Alby (20) of Kandanthara and Alfas (20) of Manjappetty.

According to the complaint, the three had gone to a soda factory after being called by the factory supervisor for a job opportunity. They were asked to report as workers from other states had returned to their hometowns, leaving vacancies at the factory.

The youths alleged that as soon as they reached the factory, a group of men stopped them, removed the key from their motorcycle and accused them of being ganja dealers. Despite repeatedly denying the allegation, they were allegedly beaten.

They claimed that when they asked to contact the police and their relatives, their mobile phones were taken away. The factory owner was reportedly not present at the time of the incident.

According to the complaint, the attackers forced the youths to kneel on the roadside before shaving their heads. They further alleged that they were taken into a room inside the factory, stripped of their clothes and assaulted again, while the migrant worker serving as the factory supervisor was kept away from them.

The victims said they were later driven away from the spot.

The three subsequently reached Perumbavoor and, accompanied by their relatives, approached the local police station to file a complaint.

They also told police that CCTV cameras in the area had captured visuals of the assault. Police have registered the complaint and are investigating the incident.

Youths and students targeted; Migrant workers sell drugs worth lakhs in villages

MANNAR: Concerns are growing over the alleged rise in the sale of ganja and other drugs in Mannar and nearby areas. Local residents claim that drug networks are targeting young people and students.

Residents say the problem has worsened after Operation Toofan was launched in neighbouring Chennithala. As part of the operation, a joint team of panchayat officials, Excise officers and police conducted inspections at the residences of migrant workers and seized drugs worth several lakh rupees.

Following the crackdown, locals allege that some of those involved in the drug trade shifted their operations to neighbouring Mannar.

Drug use and trafficking have reportedly increased along the banks of the Pamba River and in isolated lanes with little public movement. Residents also claim that many of the drug users are migrant workers.

According to locals, drugs are brought from other states at low prices and distributed through sub-agents before being sold in the area.

Residents have also raised concerns over alleged drug sales around the Mannar Bus Stand, especially at night when the area is poorly lit. They claim the bus stand and its surroundings have become a regular gathering place for drug users after dark.

Police crackdown on suspected drug traffickers meets fierce resistance

Alleged attacks by suspected drug traffickers are escalating amid 'Operation Toofan', forcing the police to alter their operational strategy. Officers are exercising greater caution as resistance to the anti-drug crackdown has intensified.

Police sources said the cyber cell had already identified several persons who had been in touch with inter-State and inter-district synthetic drug traffickers by analysing call detail records with the support of Cyberdome officials.

A senior officer attached to the anti-narcotics squad said drug traffickers were trying to create fear by launching counter-attacks on police personnel to weaken the intensified crackdown. He added that the State Police Chief and the District Police Chiefs would closely monitor the situation while keeping a watch on those who incite violence to intimidate officials.

In Kozhikode district, there were three major incidents in the past one month in which the suspects were nabbed within a few days of each incident. Some of those who allegedly conspired against enforcement officials are facing investigation.

"Incidents of attacks on police personnel on duty and the spread of false information to mislead the public during enforcement actions are common. While police officers know how to deal with such tactics, the public are often unaware of them and may end up supporting drug peddlers without realising how easily facts can be manipulated," said an inspector with the shadow patrol team. He added that patrol squads would receive support from the district-level strike squad in such situations to ensure adequate manpower for handling critical situations at any time.

Officers with the District Anti-Narcotics Special Action Force said round-the-clock vigilance is now in place, with greater focus on checking more vehicles during flash inspections on highways and other identified stretches. They added that changing hotspots are identified and mapped every day to facilitate surveillance by enforcement squad members and plain-clothes police personnel attached to the special squads under various police stations.

With the intensified crackdown, the District Police Chiefs of Kozhikode City and Kozhikode Rural have instructed all police stations to immediately report incidents involving attacks on police personnel on duty and take prompt action to identify and apprehend those responsible, with a view to boosting the confidence of enforcement squads. A meeting of Station House Officers in the city and rural areas of the district will also be convened soon to review the progress of the enforcement drive and discuss issues faced by the squads to facilitate immediate remedial measures.

Drug Peddlers More Dangerous Than Maoists, Says Telangana DGP CV Anand; Calls for Tough Crackdown on Ganja Mafia

Khammam (Telangana): [Telangana](#) Director General of Police (DGP) CV Anand, an [IPS officer](#) of 1991 batch, has described drug peddlers as a greater threat than Maoists, warning that narcotics traffickers are infiltrating households and posing a serious danger to society. Calling for an uncompromising crackdown on ganja cultivation and trafficking, the state's top police officer directed the Elite Action Group for Drug Law Enforcement (EAGLE) to intensify operations against the drug network.

Speaking to the media after reviewing law and order with senior police officials in Khammam on Tuesday, the DGP said the decline in Maoist activity has coincided with an increase in illegal cannabis cultivation and smuggling, making drug trafficking one of the state's most pressing law enforcement challenges.

'Drug Peddlers More Dangerous Than Maoists'

Highlighting the growing menace of narcotics, DGP Anand said drug traffickers pose a greater threat because they are destroying families and the future of the youth.

He observed that while Maoists traditionally opposed cannabis cultivation in forest areas and even punished those involved in such activities, the weakening of Maoist influence has created opportunities for illegal ganja cultivation and trafficking networks to expand.

He stressed that the EAGLE force must come down with an "iron hand" on those involved in the cultivation, transportation and sale of cannabis.

Seize Properties, Invoke PD Act

The DGP directed the Elite Action Group for Drug Law Enforcement (EAGLE) and district police to work in close coordination to dismantle narcotics networks.

He said stringent measures should include:

- Seizure of assets acquired through ganja cultivation and trafficking.
- Invoking the Preventive Detention (PD) Act against habitual offenders.
- Intensifying coordinated operations against drug syndicates.

According to Anand, targeting the economic backbone of traffickers is essential to eliminating the drug trade.

Maoist Threat Has Declined, Not Ended

While noting that Maoist violence has significantly reduced in Telangana, the DGP cautioned against assuming that Left-Wing Extremism has been completely eliminated.

He said surveillance over surrendered Maoists should continue for another one to two years to ensure successful rehabilitation and prevent any return to extremist activities.

Anand also clarified that the elite Greyhounds anti-Naxal force has not been disbanded.

Of its approximately 1,100 personnel, around 500 have been transferred to another unit, while the remaining 600 personnel continue to serve in Greyhounds and are engaged in monitoring rehabilitation efforts and maintaining vigilance.

Traffic Management Bureau Planned

The DGP also announced the state's plan to establish a Traffic Management Bureau, modeled on the functioning of the EAGLE force.

The proposed specialised bureau will focus on improving road safety, traffic enforcement and scientific traffic management across Telangana.

Praise for Khammam Police on Cybercrime

Anand commended the Khammam police for their effective handling of cybercrime cases and urged officers to continue treating cyber offences as a top priority.

He instructed district police to:

- Strengthen surveillance of social media platforms.
- Improve conviction rates.
- Conduct regular surprise inspections.
- Enhance overall policing efficiency.

Special Team Formed in CPI(M) Leader Murder Case

Referring to the murder of CPI(M) leader Samineni Rama Rao, the DGP said he has constituted a special investigation team to trace and arrest the accused.

He expressed confidence that the investigation would make significant progress within the next month.

26 kg ganja worth Rs 13.4L seized in Rajkot, Kutch

Rajkot: Police seized more than 26 kg of ganja worth Rs 13.44 lakh in separate operations in Rajkot and Kutch districts.

While the Rajkot Rural Special Operations Group (SOG) recovered over 17 kg of ganja from a house in Upleta taluka and booked three persons, the Kachchh East SOG arrested a man with over 9.5 kg of the contraband in Anjar.

In Rajkot, the SOG raided the house of 23-year-old Siraj Visar in Chikhaliya village of Upleta taluka on July 7 after receiving a tip-off that ganja was being stored there for sale. The ganja was worth Rs 8.67 lakh.

Based on a complaint lodged by PSI GJ Zala, Upleta police registered an offence against Siraj Visar, Nawaz Madhra and Wasim Rafai.

Rajkot SP Vijaysinh Gurjar said Siraj confessed that he procured the ganja from Rafai at the behest of Madhra and that the trio planned to sell the contraband jointly. Police are investigating the supply network.

In a separate operation, the Kutch East SOG arrested 29-year-old Mukesh Valmiki with 9.54 kg of ganja worth Rs 4.77 lakh in the Anjar police station area.

Police said Mukesh is a native of Chichrod village in Bhabhar taluka of Banaskantha district and was living in the Madhavnagar Shantidham area of Anjar for the past few months. Investigators are questioning him to ascertain the source of the contraband and identify the intended recipients.

Ahmedabad, July 8 (IANS) The Ahmedabad City Crime Branch has arrested a man wanted in an earlier narcotics case along with his associate after seizing 9.8 kg of suspected ganja valued at Rs 4.9 lakh from an auto-rickshaw in the city, police said on Wednesday.

According to the Crime Branch, officers were on patrol as part of an operation to identify and take action against people involved in the illegal sale of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances when they received specific information about the movement of contraband.

Acting on the tip-off, the team intercepted an auto-rickshaw on the service road near the Adinath Stone warehouse, close to Chunilal Park Society on the CTM Narol-Naroda Road.

During a search of the vehicle, officers recovered 9.8 kg of alleged ganja valued at Rs 4.9 lakh. Police also seized other items, taking the total value of the property recovered to Rs 5,60,290.

The arrested men have been identified as Israyalkhan Khan, 33, a resident of Akola city in Maharashtra, and Mohammed Sajid Kamruddin Pathan, 42, a resident of Ramol area in Ahmedabad.

Police said Israyalkhan was already wanted in a case registered at Danilimda Police Station under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act.

He is wanted in Danilimda Police Station case under Sections 8(c), 20(b)(2)(B) and 29 of the Act.

The Crime Branch has also named another suspect, identified as Mohsin Baba of Akola city, as a wanted accused in connection with the investigation.

Following the seizure, the Crime Branch registered a fresh case at the Detection of Crime Branch (DCB) Police Station. The case has been filed under Sections 8(c), 20(b)(2)(B) and 29 of the NDPS Act.

Police said legal proceedings have been initiated against the two arrested accused in accordance with the provisions of the NDPS Act.

The investigation is continuing to establish the source of the seized contraband, its intended destination and the involvement of any other persons connected to the alleged narcotics network.

Odisha-based trucker among three held with 10kg ganja

Nagpur: Kalamna police's investigation team arrested three persons, including an Odisha-based truck driver, and seized 10kg high-grade cannabis (ganja) valued at 2.5 lakh during a late-night operation on Tuesday. Property worth around 33 lakh, including a truck, scooter and mobile phones, was also seized, reports Soumitra Bose.

Senior PI Praveen Kale said recent investigations have identified truckers operating from Odisha as a significant link in the cannabis supply chain to Nagpur, with several cases pointing towards interstate smuggling networks.

At around 2.15am, police stopped a scooter on HB Town-Chikhli Chowk road. The rider, identified as Rinku Rajput (30), initially admitted that the bags contained cannabis. During questioning, he allegedly disclosed the consignment had been brought from Odisha by his associate, Gurpreet Singh Multani. Cops traced and intercepted the truck and recovered ganja. Three accused were detained on the spot.

Dark web and cryptocurrencies emerge as new challenge in India's anti-drug fight

New Delhi: As India intensifies its campaign against narcotics, enforcement agencies are confronting a new and rapidly evolving threat — drug trafficking networks operating through the dark web and cryptocurrencies. Officials say the narcotics trade is increasingly shifting away from conventional smuggling routes, making investigations more complex and hampering efforts to trace financial transactions.

An Intelligence Bureau official said that it is no longer the routes used by narcotic cartels that pose the challenge. The trade has largely shifted to the dark web, and this poses a major challenge. Further, the transactions are fuelled by cryptocurrency, and this has aided the smugglers in concealing their networks behind digital wallets.

The official said that tracing the financial trail is very crucial in a drug smuggling operation. The conventional land, air and sea routes no longer pose a major challenge. These are the conventional methods that have been used for years by drug smugglers.

The cryptocurrency transactions being made by drug lords are what the agencies are finding hard to track. Another official said that the drug smugglers have roped in various dark web groups to help further their business. These groups operate through encrypted browsers and dedicated systems. It takes a lot to track such an operation, and going forward this would pose a major challenge for Indian agencies, the official also said.

The Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB), India's premier anti-drug agency, had between 2020 and 2024 booked 92 cases involving the dark net and cryptocurrencies. The NCB has found that the drug trade is increasingly shifting to this method and has led the agency to enhance technology and surveillance online, an official said.

Earlier this year, the NCB had busted a dark net-enabled pan-India drug distribution network. During the probe, it was found that this cartel known as Team Kalki would source high-grade LSD and MDMA from Poland, Germany and the Netherlands.

It then adopted a drop-dead technique by which the drugs would be left at a pre-determined hidden location for trusted customers. Using speed post and various couriers, the cartel managed more than 1,000 orders across the country. To conceal the money trail, it routed the funds through intermediary mule wallets.

Officials say that while the dark net remains the biggest challenge, a new trend where smaller cartels operating without the backing of the bigger cartels is emerging. The dark web has helped individuals with ample technical expertise to run a drug operation.

The official explained that the emergence of these smaller and unknown players has made the battle against drugs even more challenging. The Indian narcotics markets are largely being controlled either by the Dawood Ibrahim Syndicate or the drug lords operating out of the Golden Triangle. The D-Syndicate operates more in Maharashtra, Gujarat, and the other northern parts of the country.

It does have southern operations based in Tamil Nadu, and these narcotics are meant for some southern states and Sri Lanka. The Golden Triangle cartels focus on the northeast and also Sri Lanka through the Southern states. The drugs that land in Sri Lanka are meant for local markets, while the remaining are smuggled into Thailand.

Officials say that handling these cartels is relatively easier. They often use conventional methods and smuggle drugs using land, sea, or air routes. However, it is these unknown players who form cartels with just one or two persons is what poses the challenge.

There is no file on them, and they are largely incognito. Two to three persons with ample technical knowledge of the dark web get together and start a cartel. They are also not associated with any major syndicate, and this makes finding their trail harder, the official said.

An official said that the newer technologies do pose a challenge, with unknown and smaller cartels coming up. However, this does not mean that bigger syndicates would look to completely stop using the conventional methods. They would try to maximise their business and hence would use all possible methods available at their disposal, the official said.

Crime Branch Dismantles Key Links In Interstate Narcotics Supply Chain

The biggest crackdown came in 2024, when the Crime Branch registered 51 cases and arrested 95 suspects. Seizures included 440.732 kg of ganja, 44.58 kg of charas, 92.16 g of MD, 132 bottles of Corex cough syrup, Nitravet tablets and injectable narcotics, indicating the large volume of drugs entering the city.

Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh): Drug trafficking routes from Odisha, Chhattisgarh, Maharashtra and Rajasthan to Bhopal have come under the police scanner with the Crime Branch dismantling key links in the interstate supply chain.

Investigations revealed that narcotics were routed through border districts before being split into smaller consignments and supplied to the city through internal routes instead of main highways.

Between 2022 and 2026 (till May), the Crime Branch registered 159 cases under the NDPS Act and arrested 313 suspects. Investigators found that ganja was largely sourced from Odisha and Chhattisgarh, while charas arrived through networks operating from Rajasthan and Himachal.

MD (mephedrone) and other synthetic drugs were supplied from Maharashtra. Investigations also exposed links between interstate traffickers and local distributors.

In 2025, the Crime Branch shifted its focus to dismantling supply networks rather than merely intercepting consignments.

While large charas seizures declined, traffickers started smuggling smaller quantities of high-value synthetic drugs such as MD, LSD and smack. During the year, 49 cases were registered and 98 suspects were arrested.

The crackdown has continued in 2026, with 27 cases registered and 59 suspects arrested so far. Police have seized ganja, charas, MD, smack and doda chura.

Investigators say traffickers are increasingly using cars, auto-rickshaws and two-wheelers instead of trucks to move smaller consignments and avoid detection.

Additional DCP (Crime Branch) Shailendra Singh Chauhan said coordination with police in border districts and central agencies in other states had been strengthened.

Enhanced intelligence gathering, technical surveillance and raids have led to the arrest of several interstate traffickers.

He said the focus will remain on eliminating the narcotics supply chain from its source to street-level distribution.

Pratapgarh police freeze properties worth Rs 70L linked to drug trade

Udaipur: Pratapgarh police Wednesday froze properties worth around Rs 70 lakh allegedly acquired by two smugglers through drug trafficking as part of a drive to dismantle the economic network of narcotics smugglers.

The action was carried out under Operation Trinetra on the directions of SP B Aditya. A team from Kotri police station conducted a financial investigation into the movable and immovable assets of two accused, Akbar Khan and Nayyum Khan, who were allegedly involved in narcotics trafficking for a long time.

The probe revealed that the duo amassed properties worth crores through the illegal trade of MDMA, brown sugar and other narcotic substances. Kotri SHO Rohit Kumar subsequently prepared a proposal to freeze the properties under the NDPS Act and sent it to the competent authority of the Union govt, which approved the action and issued notices.

The action stemmed from an NDPS case registered in 2025. On Oct 31, 2025, Hathunia police arrested Akbar Khan with 2.227 kg of MD during a blockade. During the investigation, police found that the contraband was meant to be delivered to Nayyum Khan, who was subsequently arrested in April 2026.

Further financial investigations uncovered suspicious assets linked to both accused. Police found that Akbar Khan purchased five bighas of residential land in Kotri, currently valued at around Rs 50 lakh, while Nayyum Khan acquired two bighas of land worth about Rs 20 lakh from the proceeds of illegal activities.

226 arrested in Hisar anti-drug drive till July 6

Hisar: Hisar police's anti-drug crackdown gathered pace in the first half of 2026, with NDPS Act cases rising from 64 to 135 and arrests increasing from 151 to 226 compared with the corresponding period last year. The data for the period between Jan 1 and July 6 reflects a substantial increase in police action across several other crime categories in the district.

Hisar superintendent of police Sidhanth Jai said the most notable increase was recorded under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act. Action against illegal liquor trade also intensified during the period. Cases registered under the Excise Act increased from 23 during the corresponding period

in 2025 to 94 this year. The number of arrests witnessed a more than threefold increase.

In the area of cybercrime, investigators placed greater emphasis on financial recovery and digital investigations. Authorities helped recover about Rs 86 lakh for cyber fraud victims during the six-month period, while cybercrime arrests rose to 171. The enforcement strategy also extended to targeting the financial proceeds of crime. In NDPS-related investigations, properties valued at nearly Rs 1.79 crore were attached.

New Delhi: Twelve alleged drug peddlers, including a Nigerian national, have been arrested in a series of anti-narcotics operations in outer north Delhi. Police seized cocaine, [heroin](#), MDMA, ganja, poppy husk and psychotropic tablets and dismantled multiple drug supply networks. In one of the cases, five people, including a Nigerian national, were arrested and 13.99 grams of cocaine, 0.50 grams of MDMA and 0.55 grams of heroin were seized. The operation began on June 28 after police at Mukarba Chowk intercepted Umesh (32) from Jaipur, who allegedly tried to flee during routine checking, DCP Shobhit D. Saxena said. Police recovered 8.68 grams of cocaine concealed inside a cigarette packet from his bag. During interrogation, Umesh allegedly disclosed that he was working as a courier for a Jaipur-based network run by Yash Vashisth and coordinated by Vijay. Acting on the leads and technical surveillance, police arrested Vijay, who allegedly identified Nigerian national Temple Osuji as the supplier. He was arrested from Jaipur's Jagatpura area with 3.06 grams of cocaine. Police subsequently raided Yash's residence and arrested him and his accomplice, Ritika alias Ritu, recovering another 2.25 grams of cocaine, 0.50 grams of MDMA and 0.55 grams of heroin. In separate operations, police arrested Salim (26) and Mukesh (36) from Saboli Road in Narela and recovered 5 kg poppy husk; Rahul alias Asarul (28) was arrested with 276.25 grams of heroin in Narela. Police also busted an alleged psychotropic drug supply racket with the arrest of Amit alias Bhoka and Abid Ali alias Sahil Khan. A total of 1,394 Buprenorphine and Naloxone sublingual tablets weighing 132.9 grams—a commercial quantity under the NDPS Act—were recovered during follow-up raids in Shahbad Dairy and Wazirabad Road. In yet another case, Parveen (50) and Shahnaj (40) were held from a jhuggi in JJ Colony, Bawana, and 1.57 kg of ganja was recovered. Police said investigations are underway to trace the source of the contraband and identify other members of the drug networks.

Five nabbed with heroin worth Rs 80 lakh in Aligarh

The Counter Intelligence (CI) Amritsar busted a narcotics smuggling network, arresting three individuals and recovering 25 kg of heroin from their possession, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav in a statement.

The arrested accused were identified as Bhupinder Singh, a resident of Jandaur village in Hoshiarpur; Ravi Kumar, a resident of Kirpal Colony in Dasuya, Hoshiarpur; and Vishal Singh, a resident of Fatahpur in Amritsar. Apart from recovering contraband, police teams have also impounded their Hyundai Verna car (PB10-GS-7779), which was being used for drug smuggling.

The development came a day after CI Amritsar had arrested three individuals linked to two narcotics smuggling networks and recovered 13 kg heroin from their possession.

DGP Gaurav Yadav said preliminary investigations revealed that the accused operated under the direction of a cross-border smuggler and collected heroin consignments from various locations for delivery across Punjab.

Sharing operational details, he said that police teams from CI Amritsar had received reliable input that suspects Bhupinder Singh and Ravi Kumar are expected to meet their associate Vishal Singh on Mehta Road at village Gill in Amritsar for a major heroin deal.

Acting swiftly, police teams laid Nakas and intercepted Bhupinder Singh, Ravi Kumar and Vishal Singh near Dana Mandi of village Gill in Amritsar. During the search, police recovered 8 kg of heroin from Vishal Singh and 17 kg of heroin from Bhupinder Singh and Ravi Kumar.

The DGP said that further investigation is underway to establish forward and backward linkages in this case to identify all associates involved, and uncover the entire supply chain.

In this regard, a case FIR No. 44 dated 07-07-2026 under section 21, 25 and 29 of the NDPS Act has been registered at Police Station State Special Operation Cell (SSOC) Amritsar.

Bhopal: Crime Branch on Tuesday seized 13.07 kg of ganja (cannabis) from two juveniles and arrested their maternal uncle, who allegedly used them to transport and sell the contraband. Police said the accused's mother is already in jail in a narcotics case registered by the Crime Branch.

Additional DCP (Crime) Shailendra Singh Chouhan said the action followed a tip-off that some persons were trying to sell ganja near the railway station. A special team laid a trap and detained two juveniles found carrying white plastic bags under suspicious circumstances.

During questioning, the juveniles told police they had come to Bhopal with their maternal uncle, a resident of Kurwai Road in Mandi Bamora, Sagar district. They alleged that their uncle handed them bags containing ganja and asked them to look for buyers while he stayed away. On searching the bags, police recovered 7.50 kg of ganja from one bag and 6.20 kg from the other, taking the total seizure to 13.07 kg. The contraband is estimated to be worth around Rs 2.75 lakh in the illegal market. Police also seized an Android mobile phone from the juveniles for technical examination.

Based on the information provided by the minors, Crime Branch arrested their uncle. During interrogation, he allegedly confessed to procuring ganja from Odisha and supplying it in Bhopal, Mandi Bamora and nearby areas.

Police said the accused admitted to repeatedly taking the juveniles to Odisha to procure ganja consignments and using them to transport and sell the contraband.

Police also found that the accused's mother had earlier been arrested by the Crime Branch in a ganja trafficking case and is currently lodged in jail. Police suspect that the mother-son duo had been operating an organised drug trafficking network.

पहला मामला सेलाकुई थाना क्षेत्र से है। अभियोजन के अनुसार 16 दिसंबर 2020 को शाम करीब साढ़े सात बजे के करीब सेलाकुई थाना क्षेत्र में एबीसी बेयरिंग कंपनी के पास पुलिस ने आरोपी के कब्जे से 252 ग्राम चरस बरामद की थी। जिसके बाद आरोपी के खिलाफ मुकदमा दर्ज कर जेल भेज दिया गया था। मामले की विवेचना के बाद पुलिस ने 28 मार्च 2021 को आरोपपत्र न्यायालय में दाखिल किया। न्यायालय ने 26 जुलाई 2022 को आरोपी के विरुद्ध आरोप तय किए। सुनवाई के दौरान आरोपी ने न्यायालय के समक्ष अपना अपराध स्वीकार कर लिया।

सहसपुर कोतवाली का मामला

दूसरा मामला कोतवाली सहसपुर का था। अभियोजन के अनुसार 12 दिसंबर 2020 को शाम करीब साढ़े छह बजे सहसपुर कोतवाली क्षेत्र के रेड़ापुर में होरावाला जाने वाले तिराहे से लगभग 50 मीटर पहले पुलिस ने आरोपी के कब्जे से 150 ग्राम चरस बरामद की थी। जिसके बाद आरोपी के खिलाफ मुकदमा दर्ज कर जेल भेज दिया गया। विवेचना पूरी होने के बाद चार जुलाई 2021 को आरोपपत्र न्यायालय में दाखिल किया गया। न्यायालय ने सात फरवरी 2025 को आरोपी के विरुद्ध आरोप तय किए। सुनवाई के दौरान आरोपी ने न्यायालय के समक्ष अपना अपराध स्वीकार कर लिया। दोनों मामलों में अदालत ने दोषियों को जेल में बिताई अवधि व बीस-बीस हजार जुर्माने की सजा सुनाई।

दोनों आरोपियों को बीस-बीस हजार रुपये का जुर्माना लगाया गया।

रोहडू। पुलिस ने नशा तस्करी के खिलाफ चलाए जा रहे अभियान के तहत एक आरोपी को गिरफ्तार किया है। आरोपी कमल चौहान को न्यायालय के आदेश पर गिरफ्तार किया है। वह दो अलग-अलग एनडीपीएस मामलों में संलिप्त पाया गया था। पुलिस ने 17 फरवरी को गुप्त सूचना के आधार पर कार्रवाई की थी।

पुलिस थाना रोहडू ने रोहडू निवासी 31 वर्षीय कमल चौहान के पास से करीब दो ग्राम चिट्ठा (हेरोइन) बरामद किया था। इसके साथ ही एक इलेक्ट्रॉनिक वजन मशीन और 7,800 रुपये नकद मिले थे। इस संबंध में पुलिस थाना रोहडू में मामला दर्ज किया गया था।

आरोपी को नोटिस पर रिहा किया गया था। इस घटना के मात्र चार दिन बाद 21 फरवरी को पुलिस थाना चिड़गांव की टीम ने गश्त के दौरान कार्रवाई की। आरोपी कमल चौहान के पास से फिर करीब 4.5 ग्राम चिट्ठा (हेरोइन) बरामद किया। इस मामले में भी आरोपी के विरुद्ध धारा 21 एनडीपीएस अधिनियम के तहत एक और मामला दर्ज किया गया।

कमल चौहान लगातार दो एनडीपीएस मामलों में संलिप्त पाया गया। उसने धारा 35(3) बीएनएसएस के तहत जारी नोटिस की शर्तों का उल्लंघन किया। इसके बाद पुलिस ने न्यायालय से आवश्यक आदेश प्राप्त किए। पुलिस थाना रोहडू ने आरोपी कमल चौहान को गिरफ्तार कर लिया है।

पुलिस का चिट्ठा तस्करी के खिलाफ अभियान जारी रहेगा।

खंडवा जिले में गांजा की अवैध खेती करने के मामले में विशेष एनडीपीएस कोर्ट ने दो आरोपियों को दोषी करार देते हुए 3-3 साल जेल की सजा और 20-20 हजार रुपए का जुर्माना लगाया है। जुर्माना जमा नहीं करने पर 6-6 महीने की सजा और भुगतनी होगी।

फैसला विशेष न्यायाधीश एनडीपीएस एक्ट अनिल चौधरी ने बुधवार को सुनाया। कोर्ट ने गणपत पिता छगन तोमर (43) और मोतीराम पिता तुकाराम कुम्हार (63) निवासी भकराड़ा को एनडीपीएस एक्ट की धारा में दोषी पाया है। बता दें कि, दोनों आरोपियों की भूमिका अलग-अलग पाई गई थी।

शासकीय अधिवक्ता अश्विनी भाटे ने बताया कि, 17 अक्टूबर 2023 को तत्कालीन जावर टीआई गंगाप्रसाद वर्मा को मुखबिर से सूचना मिली थी कि ग्राम भकराड़ा की कोसामिया फालिया स्थित खेत में कपास और तुअर की फसल के बीच गांजे की खेती की जा रही है। सूचना के बाद पुलिस ने पंचों और इलेक्ट्रॉनिक तौल कांटे के साथ मौके पर दबिश दी।

जांच में खेत से गांजे के 20 हरे पौधे बरामद हुए, जिनका कुल वजन 4.850 किलोग्राम पाया गया। यह मात्रा छोटी मात्रा से अधिक और व्यावसायिक मात्रा से कम थी। पुलिस ने मौके पर पौधों को जब्त कर आवश्यक नमूने लिए और एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत अपराध दर्ज किया।

जमीन बंटाई पर दी थी

न्यायालय के समक्ष प्रस्तुत साक्ष्यों के अनुसार सर्वे नंबर 209 की एक हेक्टेयर कृषि भूमि गणपत को बंटाई पर दी गई थी। अभियोजन ने बताया कि इसी खेत में कपास और तुअर की फसल के बीच गांजे के पौधों का अवैध उत्पादन किया जा रहा था।

सुनवाई के दौरान जब्ती पंचनामा, एफएसएल संबंधी दस्तावेज, पुलिस अधिकारियों एवं गवाहों के बयान सहित अन्य साक्ष्य प्रस्तुत किए। न्यायालय ने उपलब्ध साक्ष्यों को पर्याप्त मानते हुए दोनों आरोपियों को दोषी ठहराया और सजा सुनाई।

फैसले में न्यायालय ने आदेश दिया कि जब्त 20 गांजे के पौधे व उनसे संबंधित मिट्टी को अपील अवधि पूरी होने के बाद नियमानुसार नष्ट किया जाए। प्रकरण में जब्त अन्य सामग्री के संबंध में भी नियमानुसार कार्रवाई करने के निर्देश दिए गए।

चार वर्ष बाद आया न्यायालय का फैसला

जिला कांगड़ा के थाना डमटाल में वर्ष 2022 में दर्ज 21.43 ग्राम हेरोइन बरामदगी मामले में करीब चार वर्ष तक चली सुनवाई के बाद न्यायालय ने दोनों आरोपियों को दोषी करार दिया। अदालत ने अभियोजन पक्ष द्वारा प्रस्तुत दस्तावेजी साक्ष्यों, जांच से जुड़े अभिलेखों तथा 17 गवाहों के बयानों का परीक्षण करने के बाद फैसला सुनाया।

मुख्य आरोपी को सात वर्ष का कठोर कारावास

न्यायालय ने आरोपी अमन वर्मा को एनडीपीएस अधिनियम की धारा 21 के तहत दोषी ठहराते हुए सात वर्ष के कठोर कारावास और एक लाख रुपये जुर्माने की सजा सुनाई। आदेश के अनुसार यदि जुर्माना जमा नहीं किया जाता है तो आरोपी को एक वर्ष का अतिरिक्त कारावास भुगतना होगा।

सह आरोपी को तीन वर्ष का कारावास

सह आरोपी रूबी को एनडीपीएस अधिनियम की धारा 25 के तहत दोषी करार देते हुए न्यायालय ने तीन वर्ष के कठोर कारावास और एक लाख रुपये जुर्माने की सजा सुनाई है। जुर्माना अदा नहीं करने की स्थिति में उसे भी एक वर्ष का अतिरिक्त कारावास भुगतना होगा।

2022 में दर्ज हुआ था मामला

अभियोजन के अनुसार 19 अप्रैल 2022 को थाना डमटाल पुलिस ने कार्रवाई के दौरान आरोपियों के कब्जे से 21.43 ग्राम हेरोइन बरामद की थी। इसके बाद एनडीपीएस अधिनियम की धारा 21 और 25 के तहत मामला दर्ज कर जांच शुरू की गई। सुनवाई के दौरान अभियोजन पक्ष ने कुल 17 गवाहों के बयान न्यायालय में दर्ज कराए, जिनके आधार पर अदालत ने दोनों आरोपियों को दोषी ठहराते हुए सजा सुनाई।

सिरसा: हरियाणा सरकार ने मादक पदार्थ तस्करी से सबसे अधिक प्रभावित सिरसा में एनडीपीएस एक्ट के मामलों के शीघ्र निपटारे के लिए एक महत्वपूर्ण निर्णय लिया है। सरकार ने वर्तमान में कार्यरत स्पेशल एनडीपीएस फास्ट ट्रैक कोर्ट के अतिरिक्त छह नई स्पेशल कोर्ट स्थापित करने की अधिसूचना जारी की है। इस कदम से जिले में कुल सात विशेष अदालतें हो जाएंगी जिससे लंबित मामलों का बोझ कम होने और न्यायिक प्रक्रिया में तेजी आने की उम्मीद है।

वर्तमान में सिरसा में मादक पदार्थ तस्करी से जुड़े मामलों की सुनवाई केवल एक स्पेशल एनडीपीएस फास्ट ट्रैक कोर्ट में हो रही है। इस कोर्ट में करीब 4250 मामले लंबित हैं जिसके कारण समयबद्ध सुनवाई और शीघ्र फैसले देना एक बड़ी चुनौती बना हुआ है।

जिला बार एसोसिएशन के उप प्रधान वरिष्ठ अधिवक्ता केवल कंबोज ने सरकार के इस निर्णय का स्वागत किया है। उन्होंने बताया कि बार एसोसिएशन ने पंजाब एवं हरियाणा हाईकोर्ट से सिरसा में एक से ज्यादा अतिरिक्त स्पेशल कोर्ट स्थापित करने की मांग उठाई थी।

मामलों की बढ़ती संख्या और न्यायिक बोझ

सिरसा में प्रतिदिन औसतन दो से तीन एनडीपीएस के नए मामले दर्ज हो रहे हैं। मामलों की लगातार बढ़ती संख्या के कारण एक ही कोर्ट पर अत्यधिक बोझ पड़ रहा था जिससे सुनवाई प्रभावित हो रही थी। अधिवक्ता केवल कंबोज ने बताया कि वर्तमान स्पेशल कोर्ट में प्रतिदिन 100 से अधिक मामलों की सुनवाई सूचीबद्ध होती है। बुधवार, 2026-07-08 को ही 25 मामले केवल जमानत याचिकाओं से संबंधित थे। इतने अधिक मामलों की सुनवाई एक न्यायाधीश के लिए बेहद कठिन होती है।

ये भी पढ़ें

छह नई स्पेशल कोर्ट की स्थापना से न्यायिक प्रक्रिया को गति मिलेगी और लंबित मामलों का बोझ काफी हद तक कम होगा। अतिरिक्त कोर्ट के शुरू होने से मामलों का तेजी से निपटारा संभव हो सकेगा जिससे न्याय मिलने में लगने वाला समय भी घटेगा। यह निर्णय जिले के लिए एक बड़ी राहत है क्योंकि इससे मादक पदार्थ तस्करी से जुड़े अपराधों पर अंकुश लगाने में भी मदद मिलेगी।

जयपुर, 08 जुलाई (हि.स.)। एंटी नारकोटिक्स टास्क फोर्स (एएनटीएफ) राजस्थान ने अंतरराज्यीय मादक पदार्थ तस्करी के खिलाफ कार्रवाई करते हुए करीब 1.69 लाख रुपये के इनामी कुख्यात तस्कर सुनील मीणा (27) को मध्यप्रदेश के नीमच जिले के जीरन क्षेत्र से गिरफ्तार किया है। एएनटीएफ टीम की ओर से चलाए गए ऑपरेशन नीलमणि के तहत करीब आठ माह तक लगातार निगरानी और खुफिया कार्रवाई के बाद यह सफलता मिली। गिरफ्तार आरोपित राजस्थान पुलिस की नारको टॉप-25 सूची में शामिल था और उसकी तलाश राजस्थान पुलिस, मध्यप्रदेश पुलिस तथा नारकोटिक्स कंट्रोल ब्यूरो (एनसीबी) को लंबे समय से थी। फिलहाल आरोपित से एएनटीएफ टीम पूछताछ करने में जुटी है।

पुलिस महानिरीक्षक (एएनटीएफ) विकास कुमार ने बताया कि गिरफ्तार आरोपित सुनील मीणा पर राजस्थान के अतिरिक्त महानिदेशक पुलिस (अपराध) की ओर से एक लाख रुपये, पाली पुलिस की ओर से 50 हजार रुपये, उदयपुर पुलिस की ओर से दो हजार रुपये, मध्यप्रदेश पुलिस की ओर से 15 हजार रुपये तथा एनसीबी मध्यप्रदेश की ओर से दो हजार रुपये का इनाम घोषित था।

पुलिस महानिरीक्षक के अनुसार सुनील ने आठवीं कक्षा तक पढ़ाई के बाद स्कूल छोड़ दिया और ईंट-भट्टे पर मजदूरी करने लगा। वर्ष 2014 में एक तस्कर के संपर्क में आने के बाद उसने डोडा चूरा तस्करी शुरू कर दी। शुरुआत में वह रात के समय तस्करी करने वाले वाहनों की एस्कोर्टिंग करता था और प्रति वाहन 500 रुपये लेता था। बाद में खुद तस्करी का नेटवर्क खड़ा कर राजस्थान तक मादक पदार्थ पहुंचाने लगा, जहां प्रति खेप 15 हजार रुपये तक मिलने लगे। धीरे-धीरे वह कई बड़े तस्कर गिरोहों का प्रमुख सहयोगी बन गया।

विकास कुमार ने बताया कि आरोपी तस्करी के दौरान पुलिस कार्रवाई से बचने के लिए कई बार फायरिंग कर चुका है। पाली के सांडेराव और देसूरी, प्रतापगढ़ के छोटी सादड़ी तथा मध्यप्रदेश के जीरन थाना क्षेत्र में उसने पुलिस पर गोलियां चलाई थीं। वर्ष 2020 में देसूरी-चारभुजा क्षेत्र में हुई फायरिंग में एक कांस्टेबल घायल भी हुआ था।

गिरफ्तारी से बचने के लिए आरोपित अपने घर की बजाय घने जंगलों में छिपकर रहता था। वह अपनी पत्नी से तय पेड़ों पर निशान बनवाकर वहीं भोजन और जरूरी सामान मंगवाता था, जिसे उसके साथी जंगल तक पहुंचाते थे। वह बेहद गोपनीय तरीके से कभी-कभार ही घर आता था।

एएनटीएफ के एक जवान को 15 दिन पहले चरवाहे के वेश में इलाके में भेजा गया था। उसने स्थानीय स्तर पर जानकारी जुटाई और पता लगाया कि आरोपित का गांव की एक युवती से भी संपर्क है, जिसके जरिए उसकी गतिविधियों का सुराग मिला। इसके बाद तकनीकी निगरानी बढ़ाई गई। दो दिन पहले एएनटीएफ की टीम जंगल के समीप पहुंची। सूचना मिली कि सुनील रात में घर आने वाला है। इसी दौरान तेज बारिश शुरू हो गई, जिसका फायदा उठाकर पुलिस ने घर की घेराबंदी कर दी। बारिश के कारण आरोपित को पुलिस की भनक नहीं लगी और वह जंगल लौटने के बजाय घर में ही रुक गया।

पुलिस ने जब दबिश दी तो परिजनों ने उसके घर में होने से इनकार कर दिया, लेकिन तलाशी के दौरान सुनील घर के अंदर एक ड्रम के पीछे रजाई ओढ़कर छिपा मिला। गिरफ्तारी के बाद उसने अपना नाम 'दिनेश' बताकर पुलिस को गुमराह करने की कोशिश की, लेकिन पूछताछ में उसने अपनी वास्तविक पहचान स्वीकार कर ली। इसके बाद पुलिस उसे सुरक्षित लेकर रवाना हो गई।

एएनटीएफ ने इस अभियान में प्रतापगढ़ पुलिस का भी सहयोग लिया। सीमावर्ती क्षेत्र और दुर्गम पहाड़ी इलाके की भौगोलिक जानकारी के कारण प्रतापगढ़ पुलिस ने तस्कर के ठिकाने तक पहुंचने और गिरफ्तारी में महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभाई।

पुलिस के अनुसार सुनील के खिलाफ राजस्थान, मध्यप्रदेश और एनसीबी में एनडीपीएस अधिनियम, आर्म्स एक्ट, हत्या के प्रयास, धोखाधड़ी सहित 19 से अधिक मामले दर्ज हैं। पुलिस अब उससे पूछताछ कर उसके नेटवर्क और अन्य तस्करों के संबंध में जानकारी जुटा रही है।

आईजीपी विकास कुमार ने बताया कि इस साहसिक अभियान को अंजाम देने वाली एएनटीएफ तथा प्रतापगढ़ पुलिस की टीम को मुख्यालय में सम्मानित किया जाएगा।

शिमला (संतोष): जिला शिमला के नेरवा पुलिस थाना क्षेत्र में अफीम की अवैध खेती के मामले में पुलिस को बड़ी कामयाबी मिली है। मामले की गहन तफ्तीश के बाद पुलिस ने मुख्य आरोपी को गिरफ्तार कर लिया है। गिरफ्तारी के बाद आरोपी को न्यायालय में पेश किया गया, जहां से उसे न्यायिक हिरासत में भेज दिया गया है। गिरफ्तार किए गए मुख्य आरोपी की पहचान नेरवा जिला शिमला निवासी भादर सिंह पुत्र चाखरू राम के रूप में हुई है। पुलिस द्वारा कोर्ट में पेश किए जाने के बाद, माननीय न्यायालय ने आरोपी भादर सिंह को 16 जुलाई तक के लिए न्यायिक हिरासत में भेज दिया है।

22 मई को नष्ट की गई थी अफीम की खेती

गौरतलब है कि नेरवा पुलिस ने 22 मई को मादक पदार्थों की अवैध खेती के खिलाफ एक बड़ा सर्च ऑपरेशन चलाया था। तब पुलिस टीम ने एक गोपनीय सूचना के आधार पर कार्रवाई करते हुए मौके पर ही अफीम के पौधों को नष्ट कर दिया था। उस समय पुलिस ने अज्ञात लोगों के खिलाफ एनडीपीएस अधिनियम की धारा 18, 61 और 85 के तहत एफआईआर दर्ज कर मामले की जांच शुरू की थी। अज्ञात के खिलाफ मामला दर्ज होने के बाद पुलिस ने वैज्ञानिक और परिस्थितिजन्य साक्ष्य जुटाने शुरू किए। इसी तफ्तीश के दौरान पुलिस को आरोपी भादर सिंह के खिलाफ पर्याप्त व पुख्ता सबूत मिले, जिसके आधार पर नेरवा पुलिस ने उसे धर दबोचा।

नशा सौदागरों के खिलाफ जारी रहेगी पुलिस की कार्रवाई

इस गिरफ्तारी के साथ ही शिमला पुलिस ने कड़ा संदेश दिया है कि जिले में नशे के काले कारोबार, मादक पदार्थों की अवैध खेती और तस्करी को किसी भी कीमत पर बर्दाश्त नहीं किया जाएगा। पुलिस स्पष्ट कर चुकी है कि नशे के सौदागरों के खिलाफ उनका अभियान लगातार जारी है और भविष्य में भी ऐसे अवैध धंधों में शामिल लोगों पर कानून का सख्त डंडा चलता रहेगा।

शिमला (संतोष): जिला शिमला के नेरवा पुलिस थाना क्षेत्र में अफीम की अवैध खेती के मामले में पुलिस को बड़ी कामयाबी मिली है। मामले की गहन तफ्तीश के बाद पुलिस ने मुख्य आरोपी को गिरफ्तार कर लिया है। गिरफ्तारी के बाद आरोपी को न्यायालय में पेश किया गया, जहां से उसे न्यायिक हिरासत में भेज दिया गया है। गिरफ्तार किए गए मुख्य आरोपी की पहचान नेरवा जिला शिमला निवासी भादर सिंह पुत्र चाखरू राम के रूप में हुई है। पुलिस द्वारा कोर्ट में पेश किए जाने के बाद, माननीय न्यायालय ने आरोपी भादर सिंह को 16 जुलाई तक के लिए न्यायिक हिरासत में भेज दिया है।

22 मई को नष्ट की गई थी अफीम की खेती

गौरतलब है कि नेरवा पुलिस ने 22 मई को मादक पदार्थों की अवैध खेती के खिलाफ एक बड़ा सर्च ऑपरेशन चलाया था। तब पुलिस टीम ने एक गोपनीय सूचना के आधार पर कार्रवाई करते हुए मौके पर ही अफीम के पौधों को नष्ट कर दिया था। उस समय पुलिस ने अज्ञात लोगों के खिलाफ एनडीपीएस अधिनियम की धारा 18, 61 और 85 के तहत एफआईआर दर्ज कर मामले की जांच शुरू की थी। अज्ञात के खिलाफ मामला दर्ज होने के बाद पुलिस ने वैज्ञानिक और परिस्थितिजन्य साक्ष्य जुटाने शुरू किए। इसी तफ्तीश के दौरान पुलिस को आरोपी भादर सिंह के खिलाफ पर्याप्त व पुख्ता सबूत मिले, जिसके आधार पर नेरवा पुलिस ने उसे धर दबोचा।

नशा सौदागरों के खिलाफ जारी रहेगी पुलिस की कार्रवाई

इस गिरफ्तारी के साथ ही शिमला पुलिस ने कड़ा संदेश दिया है कि जिले में नशे के काले कारोबार, मादक पदार्थों की अवैध खेती और तस्करी को किसी भी कीमत पर बर्दाश्त नहीं किया जाएगा। पुलिस स्पष्ट कर चुकी है कि नशे के सौदागरों के खिलाफ उनका अभियान लगातार जारी है और भविष्य में भी ऐसे अवैध धंधों में शामिल लोगों पर कानून का सख्त डंडा चलता रहेगा।

कफ सिरप के दो तस्कर पीआईटी-एनडीपीएस ऐक्ट में निरुद्ध

गाजियाबाद में पुलिस ने कोडीन युक्त कफ सिरप की अवैध तस्करी के मामले में दो तस्करों को गिरफ्तार किया है। पहले उनकी संपत्ति को एनडीपीएस ऐक्ट के तहत फ्रीज किया गया था। इस कार्रवाई के दौरान 1150 पेटी कफ सिरप और अन्य सामग्री बरामद की गई। दोनों आरोपियों को 12 महीने तक जेल में रखा जाएगा।

गाजियाबाद, योगेन्द्र सागर। कमिश्नर पुलिस ने कोडीन युक्त कफ सिरप की अवैध तस्करी के मामले में बड़ी कार्रवाई करते हुए दो तस्करों को पीआईटी-एनडीपीएस ऐक्ट के तहत निरुद्ध कर दिया है। इससे पहले दोनों आरोपियों की करीब 15 करोड़ रुपये की संपत्ति एनडीपीएस ऐक्ट के तहत फ्रीज की जा चुकी है। अब इस कार्रवाई के बाद दोनों आरोपियों को 12 महीने तक जेल में निरुद्ध रखा जा सकेगा। कमिश्नर में पिछले दस वर्षों के दौरान इस ऐक्ट के तहत यह पहली कार्रवाई मानी जा रही है। एडिशनल सीपी कानून व्यवस्था एवं यातायात राज करन नैय्यर ने बताया कि पीआईटी-एनडीपीएस में निरुद्ध किए गए आरोपी सहारनपुर निवासी सगे भाई विभोर राणा और विशाल सिंह हैं।

कार्रवाई का विवरण

एडिशनल सीपी कानून व्यवस्था एवं यातायात राज करन नैय्यर ने बताया कि तीन नवंबर 2025 की रात स्नॉट टीम और नंदग्राम पुलिस ने मेरठ रोड स्थित मछली गोदाम परिसर में बरेली-गोरखपुर ट्रांसपोर्ट के गोदाम पर छापा मारा था। पुलिस ने मौके से आठ आरोपियों को गिरफ्तार किया था। उनकी निशानदेही पर वहां खड़े चार ट्रकों से 1150 पेटी कोडीन युक्त कफ सिरप बरामद की गई थी। इनमें 850 पेटी एस्कफ कफ सिरप और 300 पेटी फेन्सीडिल कफ सिरप शामिल थीं। मौके से एक कार, दस मोबाइल फोन, कई सिम कार्ड तथा फर्जी मोहरें भी बरामद हुई थीं। इस मामले में नंदग्राम थाने में एनडीपीएस ऐक्ट और अन्य धाराओं में मुकदमा दर्ज किया गया था। विवेचना के दौरान मिले साक्ष्यों के आधार पर सहारनपुर निवासी दो सगे भाइयों विभोर राणा और विशाल सिंह का नाम सामने आया। दोनों को गिरफ्तार कर पूछताछ की गई और पर्याप्त साक्ष्य मिलने पर उनके खिलाफ आरोप पत्र न्यायालय में दाखिल किया गया। जांच में सामने आया था कि आरोपियों ने अवैध कारोबार से बड़ी संपत्ति अर्जित की है। इसी आधार पर अपराध शाखा ने पहले ही एनडीपीएस ऐक्ट के तहत दोनों की करीब 15 करोड़ रुपये की चल-अचल संपत्ति फ्रीज कराई थी।

दोबारा तस्करी की संभावना के मद्देनजर हुई कार्रवाई

एडिशनल सीपी ने बताया कि विभोर राणा और विशाल सिंह लंबे समय से कोडीन युक्त कफ सिरप की अवैध तस्करी में सक्रिय थे। जांच एजेंसियों को आशंका थी कि यदि दोनों को संबंधित मुकदमे में जमानत मिल जाती तो वह फिर से मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी में जुट जाते। इसी आशंका के आधार पर अपराध शाखा और नंदग्राम पुलिस ने ऑपरेशन प्रहार के तहत पीआईटी-एनडीपीएस ऐक्ट के अंतर्गत कार्रवाई का प्रस्ताव तैयार किया, जिसे मंजूरी मिलने के बाद दोनों आरोपियों को निरुद्ध कर दिया गया।

क्या है पीआईटी-एनडीपीएस

पुलिस अधिकारियों के अनुसार पीआईटी-एनडीपीएस ऐक्ट, एनडीपीएस ऐक्ट से अलग कानून है। एनडीपीएस ऐक्ट में अपराध होने पर गिरफ्तारी, मुकदमा और सजा का प्रावधान है, जबकि पीआईटी-एनडीपीएस ऐक्ट का उद्देश्य ऐसे तस्करों को भविष्य में अपराध करने से रोकना है। इस अधिनियम के तहत सरकार किसी आरोपी को अधिकतम 12 माह तक निवारक निरोध में रख सकती है। अधिकारियों का कहना है कि मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी के संगठित नेटवर्क पर शिकंजा कसने के लिए आगे भी ऐसे मामलों में पीआईटी-एनडीपीएस ऐक्ट के तहत कार्रवाई जारी रहेगी।

A&N Police Disposes of 69.534 Kg of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances as Part of Nationwide Drug Disposal Campaign

Sri Vijaya Puram, July 8: In pursuance of the Nationwide Drug Disposal Campaign being observed from 26th June to 10th July, 2026, and as part of its continuing efforts against drug trafficking and substance abuse, the Andaman & Nicobar Police successfully carried out the disposal of seized narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances pertaining to 63 NDPS cases on 08th July, 2026, in accordance with the provisions of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985 and the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (Seizure, Storage, Sampling and Disposal) Rules, 2022.

The disposal comprised a total of 69.534 kg of narcotic drugs and psychotropic substances, including 14.554 kg of Ganja, 38.592 kg of Methamphetamine, 14.145 kg of Methaqualone and 2.243 kg of Cocaine, having an estimated illicit market value of approximately ₹43.58 crore, calculated as per the prescribed rates used for valuation of seized drugs. The seized contraband was destroyed through scientific incineration at the authorised incineration facility of INHS Dhanvantri, Minnie Bay, strictly adhering to the prescribed legal procedures, safety protocols and environmental safeguards.

The disposal drive was conducted under the overall leadership and guidance of Shri Ravindra Yadav, IPS, Director General of Police, A&N Islands, Smti. Geeta Rani Verma, IPS, IGP (HQ) in the presence of senior police officers and Members of the Drug Disposal Committee chaired by Shri Jitendra Kumar Meena, IPS, Deputy Inspector General of Police (CID), with Shri Balram, Superintendent of Police (HQ), and Ms. Niyati Mittal, Superintendent of Police (APU), as Members of the Committee. The entire disposal process was conducted in accordance with the prescribed statutory procedures, ensuring transparency, accountability and compliance with the applicable safety and environmental norms.

The successful destruction of the seized narcotic drugs reflects the unwavering commitment of the Andaman & Nicobar Police towards effective enforcement of the NDPS Act, timely disposal of seized contraband, prevention of its misuse and recycling into illicit channels, and strengthening of the criminal justice system.

The Andaman & Nicobar Police continue to adopt a zero-tolerance approach against drug trafficking through intelligence-based enforcement, financial investigation, inter-agency coordination, capacity building and sustained public awareness programmes. Over 119 Kg Ganja Seized In Jharsuguda, Smuggling Bid Foiled

Jharsuguda: Jharsuguda Police have seized 119.860 kg of ganja of commercial quantity and seized the vehicle allegedly used for its transportation during a night patrolling operation, dealing a major blow to an illegal narcotics smuggling network in the district.

The seizure was made by a team from Rengali Police Station during the intervening night of July 7 and 8 as part of the ongoing Nasha Mukta Odisha Abhiyan. The operation was conducted near Govindpur Toll Gate, where the patrolling team spotted a suspicious vehicle moving at high speed.

According to police, a team led by Sub-Inspector Puspa Khamari was conducting night patrolling when they noticed a white Maruti Ertiga travelling from Lakhanpur towards Kanaktora at around 3:50 am. When police signalled the vehicle to stop, the driver allegedly accelerated and attempted to flee.

The police team chased the vehicle up to the Katarbaga RI Office area. However, the driver abandoned the vehicle on Darridhipa Road and escaped into a nearby forest, taking advantage of the darkness.

During a search conducted in the presence of an Executive Magistrate and independent witnesses, police recovered three plastic bags containing 119.860 kg of ganja from the abandoned vehicle. Two additional registration number plates were also recovered, indicating an attempt to conceal the identity of the vehicle.

Police seized the contraband ganja, the white Maruti Ertiga, and the two additional number plates as part of the investigation.

A case has been registered at Rengali Police Station vide Case No. 184 dated July 8, 2026, under Section 20(b)(ii)(C) of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act.

Police have launched an investigation to identify and arrest the absconding accused and trace the interstate network allegedly involved in the illegal transportation of narcotics.

Jharsuguda Police said that strict action against drug traffickers will continue under the Nasha Mukta Odisha Abhiyan and appealed to citizens to share information related to narcotics activities to help curb the illegal trade.

जागरण संवाददाता, चतरा। चतरा जिला मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी का बड़ा केंद्र बन गया है। अफीम और ब्राउन शुगर की तस्करी के लिए पूरे देश में बदनाम है। यहां के युवक झारखंड और बिहार ही नहीं, दिल्ली, पंजाब, उत्तर प्रदेश, राजस्थान आदि कई प्रदेशों के सलाखों के पीछे जिंदगी काट रहे हैं। यह घोर चिंता का विषय है। इस अवैध कारोबार में युवा तेजी से फंस रहे हैं।

त्वरित कमाई के लालच में वे नशा तस्करों के नेटवर्क का हिस्सा बन रहे हैं और गिरफ्तारी के बाद उनकी जवानी सलाखों के पीछे कट रही है। जिले में जनवरी से 20 जून तक के उपलब्ध आंकड़े स्थिति की गंभीरता को उजागर करते हैं। इस अवधि में एनडीपीएस एक्ट के 58 मामले दर्ज किए गए, जिनमें 82 आरोपियों की गिरफ्तारी हुई। यानी हर महीने औसतन 14 तस्करों को जेल भेजा गया।

गिरफ्तार आरोपियों में लगभग 99 प्रतिशत युवा वर्ग से हैं। यह इस बात का संकेत है कि नशा तस्करों का सबसे आसान निशाना बेरोजगार और कम उम्र के युवक बन रहे हैं। एक-दो नहीं, बल्कि दर्जनभर से अधिक मामलों में अंतरराज्यीय गिरोहों की संलिप्तता सामने आई है। सीमावर्ती इलाकों का लाभ उठाकर तस्कर मादक पदार्थों की खेप एक राज्य से दूसरे राज्य तक पहुंचा रहे हैं। लगातार छापेमारी के बावजूद नेटवर्क पूरी तरह नहीं टूट सका है।

तीन हजार एकड़ में अवैध अफीम की खेती की गई नष्ट

पुलिस ने इस वर्ष मादक पदार्थों के खिलाफ अभियान को और तेज किया है। विशेष अभियान चलाकर तीन हजार एकड़ से अधिक क्षेत्र में लगी अवैध अफीम की खेती नष्ट की गई। यह कार्रवाई बताती है कि जिले में अवैध खेती का दायरा कितना व्यापक था।

हालांकि विशेषज्ञों का मानना है कि केवल खेती नष्ट करने से समस्या का समाधान नहीं होगा। इसके लिए तस्करी के पूरे नेटवर्क, आर्थिक स्रोत और खरीद-बिक्री की श्रृंखला पर एक साथ कार्रवाई करनी होगी।

रोजगार की कमी और लालच बना बड़ी वजह

सामाजिक जानकारों का कहना है कि बेरोजगारी, तेजी से पैसा कमाने की चाह और गलत संगत युवाओं को इस दलदल में धकेल रही है। गांवों तक फैले तस्करों के एजेंट युवाओं को मामूली रकम का लालच देकर नशीले पदार्थों की दुलाई और बिक्री में लगा देते हैं। पहली बार में आसान कमाई का आकर्षण उन्हें अपराध की दुनिया में ले जाता है, जहां से लौटना मुश्किल हो जाता है।

जागरूकता की जरूरत, तभी टूटेगा नेटवर्क

पुलिस लगातार कार्रवाई कर रही है, लेकिन केवल गिरफ्तारी से इस समस्या का स्थायी समाधान संभव नहीं है। जरूरत है कि गांव-गांव तक जनजागरूकता अभियान चलाए जाएं, युवाओं को रोजगार और कौशल विकास से जोड़ा जाए तथा अभिभावकों को भी सतर्क किया जाए। सीमावर्ती क्षेत्रों में निगरानी, खुफिया तंत्र को मजबूत करने और जनसहयोग बढ़ाने से ही नशे के इस नेटवर्क पर प्रभावी अंकुश लगाया जा सकता है।

चतरा में अपर जिला सत्र न्यायाधीश की अदालत ने एनडीपीएस मामले में गोपाल कुमार यादव को 10 साल की कठिन कारावास की सजा सुनाई। उसके खिलाफ मामले में 7 गवाहों की गवाही हुई और 2 किलो गिला अफीम व ₹4000 की जब्ती की गई। दूसरा आरोपी अभी भी फरार है।

चतरा, विधि संवाददाता: अपर जिला सत्र न्यायाधीश चतुर्थ सूरज प्रकाश ठाकुर की अदालत ने बुधवार को एनडीपीएस केस के अभियुक्त कुंदा थाना क्षेत्र के पिंजा गांव निवासी गोपाल कुमार यादव पिता नागेश्वर यादव को 10 वर्ष की कठिन कारावास की सजा तथा एक लाख जुर्माना भी लगाया गया है। जुर्माना नहीं देने पर एक वर्ष की अधिक सजा भुगतना होगा।

इस केस के अपर लोक अभियोजक नंदलाल सिंह ने कुल 7 गवाहों की गवाही करा कर अभियुक्त को सजा के अंजाम तक पहुंचाया। आगे उन्होंने बताया कि यह मामला सदर थाना कांड संख्या 164 /2019 दिनांक 7.6 2019 का है।

घटना के दिन पुलिस को गुप्त सूचना मिली थी उस सूचना के आधार पर पुलिस त्वरित कार्रवाई करते हुए शाम के 7:30 बजे न एच 99 में लडकूआ मोड़ के पास जलेद जाने वाले रास्ते के समीप पहुंचे। वहां पहुंचने पर पुलिस सतर्क हो गई। इसके बाद एक मोटरसाइकिल जलेद की तरफ से आया पुलिस के द्वारा उसे रोकने के लिए टॉर्च दिखाए जाने पर पुलिस को देखकर मोटरसाइकिल सवार भागने लगा। तो पुलिस बल के द्वारा पीछा करने पर एक व्यक्ति को मोटरसाइकिल सहित पकड़ लिया गया और एक व्यक्ति जंगल का लाभ लेकर भाग गया।

पकड़ाये गये व्यक्ति ने अपना नाम गोपाल कुमार यादव बताया और भागने वाले व्यक्ति के नाम लालू प्रसाद यादव बताया है। तलाशी लेने पर 2 किलो गिला अफीम बरामद हुआ। तथा ₹4000 नगद भी बरामद किया गया। मोटरसाइकिल बिना नंबर का था। इसके बाद जब्ती सूची बनाकर एनडीपीएस की सुसंगत धाराओं में प्राथमिक की दर्ज कर अभियुक्त को जेल भेज दिया गया। दूसरे अभियुक्त का इन्वेस्टिगेशन जारी है।

Drug smuggling case Sitamarhi: सीतामढ़ी जिले में नशीली दवाओं की तस्करी के खिलाफ पुलिस और न्यायपालिका की सख्त कार्रवाई लगातार जारी है। इसी क्रम में प्रथम जिला एवं सत्र न्यायाधीश (एडीजे) वन की अदालत ने नशीली दवा तस्करी से जुड़े दो अलग-अलग मामलों में दलीलें सुनने के बाद तीन अभियुक्तों को दोषी पाते हुए कारावास की सजा सुनाई है। इसके साथ ही अदालत ने दोषियों पर आर्थिक जुर्माना भी लगाया है।

पुलिस सूत्रों से मिली आधिकारिक जानकारी के अनुसार, पहला मामला परिहार थाना क्षेत्र से जुड़ा है। परिहार थाना कांड संख्या 300/2025 (धारा 8/20(बी)(2)(बी) एनडीपीएस एक्ट) के तहत सुनवाई करते हुए अदालत ने आरोपी खुशरूल अंसारी को दोषी करार दिया। माननीय न्यायाधीश ने इस मामले की गंभीरता को देखते हुए दोषी खुशरूल अंसारी को 9 माह के कारावास की सजा सुनाई। इसके साथ ही उस पर दो हजार रुपये का अर्थदंड (जुर्माना) भी लगाया गया है।

चोरौत के दो दोषियों को भी मिली कारावास की सजा

नशीली दवा तस्करी से जुड़ा दूसरा मामला चोरौत थाना क्षेत्र का है। चोरौत थाना कांड संख्या 95/2025 (धारा 8/20(बी)(2)(बी) एनडीपीएस एक्ट) के तहत अदालत में सुनवाई पूरी की गई। इस मामले में संलिप्त पाए गए दो अभियुक्तों- लक्ष्मण राय एवं राम प्रसाद खतवे के खिलाफ दोष सिद्ध होने पर अदालत ने फैसला सुनाया। माननीय न्यायालय ने दोनों दोषियों को 13-13 दिन के कारावास की सजा सुनाई है। इन दोनों अभियुक्तों पर भी अलग-अलग राशियों में जुर्माना लगाया गया है।

जागरण संवाददाता, बेतिया (पश्चिम चंपारण)। West Champaran Ganja Smuggling: भारत-नेपाल सीमा पर मादक पदार्थों की तस्करी के खिलाफ चलाए जा रहे अभियान के तहत पश्चिम चंपारण में एसएसबी और भंगहा थाना पुलिस ने बड़ी कार्रवाई की है।

पचरौता इलाके में संयुक्त छापेमारी के दौरान 75.3 किलोग्राम गांजा के साथ एक तस्कर को गिरफ्तार किया गया। हालांकि उसके दो साथी सुरक्षा बलों को चकमा देकर नेपाल की ओर भाग निकले। उनकी तलाश जारी है।

सीमा पार से लाई जा रही थी खेप

भंगहा थानाध्यक्ष रौशन कुमार ने बताया कि गुप्त सूचना के आधार पर पचरौता एसएसबी और भंगहा थाना पुलिस की संयुक्त टीम ने पचरौता समवाय क्षेत्र के तीन मोहानी पुल के पास अंतरराष्ट्रीय सीमा स्तंभ संख्या 429 के समीप घेराबंदी की।

इसी दौरान नेपाल की ओर से सिर पर बोरी लेकर भारतीय सीमा में प्रवेश कर रहे तीन संदिग्धों पर जवानों की नजर पड़ी। पुलिस टीम को देखते ही तीनों भागने लगे। जवानों ने पीछा कर एक तस्कर को दबोच लिया, जबकि दो आरोपी सीमा पार नेपाल की ओर फरार हो गए।

तीन बोरियों से बरामद हुआ गांजा

तलाशी के दौरान मौके से तीन बोरियां बरामद हुईं। इनमें कुल 75.3 किलोग्राम गांजा मिला, जिसे पुलिस ने जब्त कर लिया। बरामद खेप की अंतरराष्ट्रीय बाजार में कीमत का भी आकलन किया जा रहा है।

गिरफ्तार तस्कर की पहचान मानपुर थाना क्षेत्र के खैरवा टोला निवासी 39 वर्षीय रविंद्र यादव के रूप में हुई है।

फरार तस्करों की तलाश में जुटी एजेंसियां

प्रारंभिक पूछताछ में सामने आया है कि गांजे की खेप नेपाल से भारत लाई जा रही थी। पुलिस अब यह पता लगाने में जुटी है कि इस खेप को कहां पहुंचाया जाना था और इसके पीछे कौन-सा नेटवर्क सक्रिय है।

फरार दोनों तस्करों की पहचान और सत्यापन की प्रक्रिया भी शुरू कर दी गई है। सीमा क्षेत्र में निगरानी बढ़ा दी गई है ताकि उन्हें जल्द गिरफ्तार किया जा सके।

एनडीपीएस एक्ट के तहत मामला दर्ज

पुलिस ने बरामद गांजा को जब्त कर एनडीपीएस एक्ट की संबंधित धाराओं में प्राथमिकी दर्ज कर ली है। गिरफ्तार आरोपित से पूछताछ जारी है।

आवश्यक कानूनी प्रक्रिया पूरी करने के बाद उसे न्यायिक हिरासत में भेजा जा रहा है। साथ ही इस तस्करी नेटवर्क से जुड़े अन्य लोगों की भी जांच की जा रही है।
